Gloria:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 14: 21-27

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith. Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, for the old order has passed away."

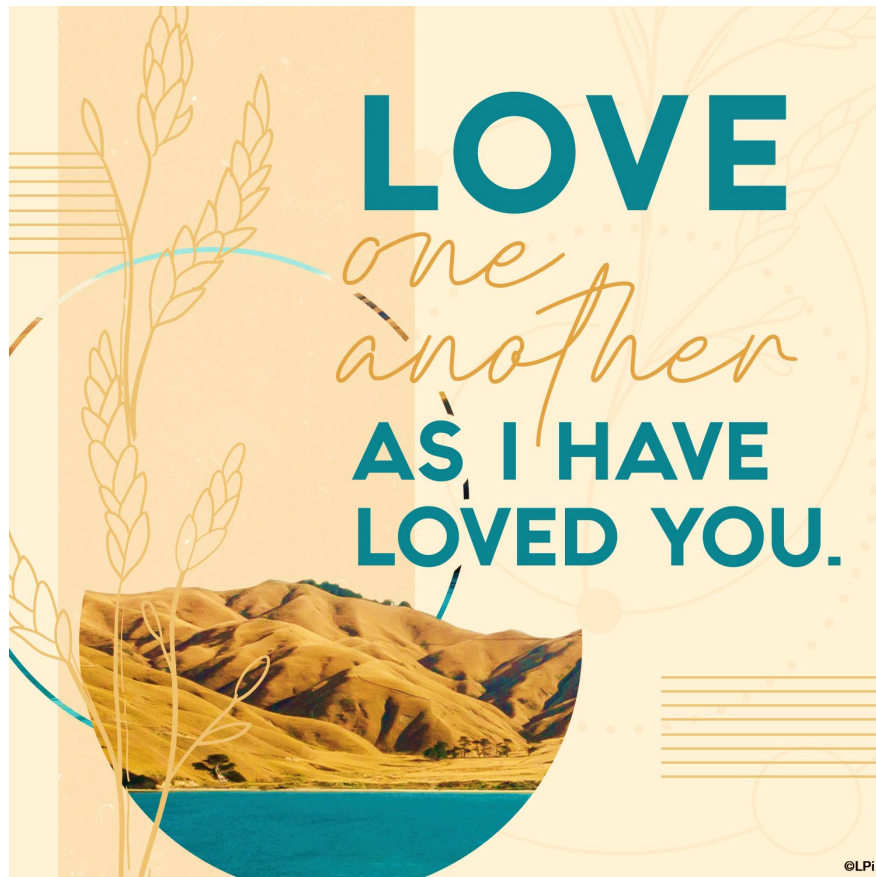
Profession of Faith:

My Dear Friends,

Please read this article from Rev. William J. Reilly:

“My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. ... I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so must you love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.”
(John 13: 33-35)

Jesus told us ‘that by their fruits you will know them.’ In the early days of the church non-Christians observed believers and remarked ‘see the Christians how they love one another.’ This is not a surprise, as we have been taught and commanded by Jesus.

How sad that so many spend their time criticizing the church, the weakness and human deficiencies, not realizing that we are the body of Christ. There is a great distinction between division and diversity. Did Jesus not pray, ‘that all may be one.’ Consider one person you can address and speak to them of unity not division. The old adage, ‘if you cannot say something well of a person, say nothing.’

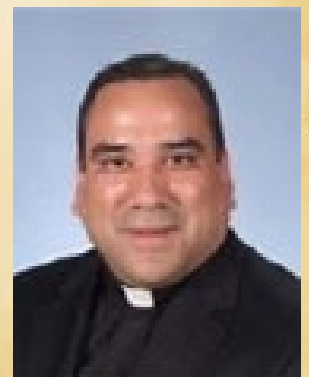

Director of Music Ministry Update

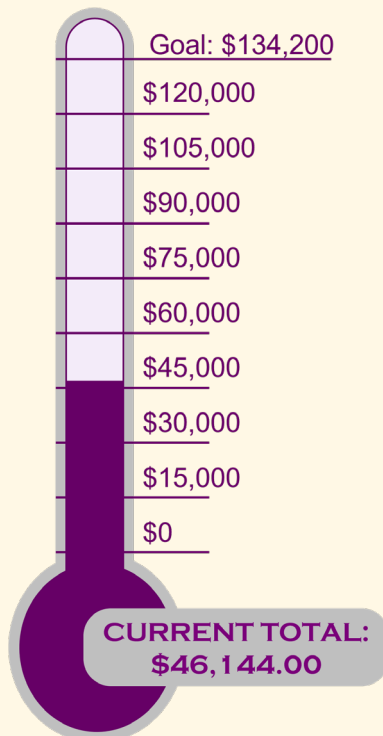
Last Friday Barbara Sykora shared with me that she has resigned as Director of Music and Liturgy.

May 15th Saint Isidore's Feast Day



St. Isidore, the farmer, was born in Madrid, Spain, between 1070 and 1080. Isidore came from a poor and humble family, thus in his youth he began working as a farm hand on the de Vargas estate. Even as a child, he was very prayerful and particularly devoted to the Mass and the Holy Eucharist, and that devotion continued into his adult life. He always attended daily Mass, no matter the duties required of him on the farm. In fact, Master de Vargas told his neighbors that he often saw a herd of white oxen, led by angels, plowing the fields while Isidore was in church. Hence, the saying arose, "St. Isidore plowing with angels does the work of three farmers."

Isidore married a sweet and pious maid-servant by the name of Maria Torribia, who is a beatified saint. Their shared feast day is celebrated on May 15th. Maria and Isidore had one son, who died in youth. After their son's death, Maria and Isidore, convinced that it was God's will that they not have children, agreed to live together celibately for the rest of their life and serve God. Both were most charitable and ever willing to help their neighbors in distress and the poor in the city slums. Whenever those that were hungry knocked on Maria and Isidore's door, the couple would open their home and share whatever food they had, content on living off leftovers.

By the time of his death on May 15, 1130, Isidore the Farmer had become a legend. So much so that when Spanish explorers began to arrive and settle in New Mexico in the 1500s, they chose Isidore as their patron to help them during periods of drought and famine. Through Isidore's intercession, miracles occurred, and the once barren lands of New Mexico produced an abundance of crops. Isidore's canonization was prompted when King Philip III of Spain was cured of a life-threatening sickness when relics of Isidore were placed at his bedside. St. Isidore was officially canonized on March 22, 1622, and is the patron saint of farmers, rural laborers, and the protector of the National Catholic Rural Life Conference. His saintly remains, as well as that of Maria, can be found over the main altar of the Cathedral in Madrid, Spain.

How beautiful and appropriate for the Catholic farm family to be devoted to this simple and saintly couple who, like farmers everywhere, are "partners with God" in furnishing the world with food, fiber, and shelter.
