Gloria:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

First Reading: 1 Kings 19: 16b, 19-21

The LORD said to Elijah: "You shall anoint Elisha, son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah, as prophet to succeed you." Elijah set out and came upon Elisha, son of Shaphat, as he was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen; he was following the twelfth. Elijah went over to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, "Please, let me kiss my father and mother goodbye, and I will follow you." Elijah answered, "Go back! Have I done anything to you?" Elisha left him, and taking the yoke of oxen, slaughtered them; he used the plowing equipment for fuel to boil their flesh, and gave it to his people to eat. Then Elisha left and followed Elijah as his attendant.

Second Reading: Galatians 5: 1, 13-18

Brothers and sisters: For freedom Christ set us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery. For you were called for freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh; rather, serve one another through love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, *You shall love your neighbor as yourself*. But if you go on biting and devouring one another, beware that you are not consumed by one another.

I say, then: live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh. For the flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; these are opposed to each other, so that you may not do what you want. But if you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

Gospel: Luke 9: 51-62

When the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled, he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem, and he sent messengers ahead of him. On the way they entered a Samaritan village to prepare for his reception there, but they would not welcome him because the destination of his journey was Jerusalem. When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?" Jesus turned and rebuked them, and they journeyed to another village.

And to another he said, "Follow me." But he replied, "Lord, let me go first and bury my father." But he answered him, "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." And another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."


Profession of Faith:

Administrator's Note

My Dear Friends,

In the Gospel today, we hear Jesus say, "Follow Me." In the Gospel reading alone, the word "Follow" was used three times. The emphasis has been placed on this word, and we need to meditate upon it. Questions? "Who Do We Follow?" "Do We Keep Our Eyes on the Lord?" Or are we easily distracted by the things of the world? Please read this wonderful article from Pen & Ink Reflections.

Each of us faces our own challenges in following Jesus. I am confident that you will each have recognized something of yourself in those first would-be followers of Jesus. So, whether for you the challenge and the cost of discipleship lies in giving over control to God, or in resigning safety and security, or in being prepared to risk losing the approval of others there is a challenge. It is a challenge that exists for our ultimate growth and wholeness. As we deepen our faith and continue on the Christian way, so gradually we learn to let go of some of those deeply ingrained patterns of life and behavior that we no longer need.

For what is it for each of us to follow Jesus? It means paying attention to ALL of the teachings that Jesus gave, especially major directives such as the command to love even our enemies. Those of us who like to feel safe and in control can sometimes find great comfort in reading Jesus' teachings as simply instructions. But following Jesus is something more deeply transformative of our whole being as individuals, and consequently of our world as we live in it as renewed people.

Jesus was the most completely alive human being who ever lived. He shows us what it is to live not out of fear and its defense mechanisms but out of love. To follow Him is to seek to become fully alive, to become fully the human being that God intended us to be before we learned to defend ourselves so effectively against our fears. For each of us the path and its challenges will be slightly different. For all of us the path leads to wholeness and transformation in Jesus Christ, 'Follow me'. Amen.

Update regarding the Parish Music Ministry:



In 1674, Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque received several visitations of Jesus Christ emphasizing his love for humanity. Over 13 months of visitations, Jesus said the human heart was to be the symbol of his divine human love. He explained to Saint Margaret Mary the devotion to His Sacred Heart and how this devotion was to be practiced: “Our blessed Lord commanded that all who wish to take up the devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus go to Confession and receive Holy Communion often, especially on the First Friday of each Month. Friday is significant because it recalls Good Friday when Christ took on the passion and laid down His life for the many. If unable to make it on Friday, He called us to make a point of receiving the Holy Eucharist on Sunday, or any other day, with the intention of making reparation and render atonement and to rejoice in the Heart of our Savior. He also asked that we keep the devotion by venerating an image of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and making prayers and sacrifices offered out of love for Him and for the conversion of sinners. Our blessed Lord then gave to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque promises for those who take up this sacred and special devotion.” (F.C. Ziegler, Co. website)

Twelve Promises to Those Who Hold a True Devotion to His Sacred Heart:

1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
2. I will give peace in their families and will unite families that are divided.
3. I will console them in all their troubles.
4. I will be their refuge during life and above all in death.
5. I will bestow the blessings of Heaven on all their enterprises.
6. Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall rise quickly to great perfection.
9. I will bless those places wherein the image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored and will imprint My love on the hearts of those who would wear this image on their person. I will also destroy in them all disordered movements.
10. I will give to priests who are animated by a tender devotion to my Divine Heart the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart, never to be effaced.
12. THE GREATEST PROMISE - I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who Receive Holy Communion on the First Friday in nine consecutive months, the grace of final penitence: they will not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their Sacraments. My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.


