Readings for the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

<u>Gloria</u>:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. Gospel: Luke 16: 19-31

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

In this past Tuesday morning's Gospel reading Jesus says, "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it." (Luke 8:21) Wow! Just think about it. To be in the FAMILY of Jesus Christ. We get proud of our own families' accomplishments, achievements, children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, etc. We are able to express certain joy and pride in a good way. But to be a disciple of Christ is to "hear the Word of God and act on it." (Luke 8:21). The call to discipleship, Family! Our Lord wants us to have the enthusiasm to serve and bring His Good News to others.

The following is taken from Loyola Press. Hope you enjoy it.

In the parable found in today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the life of a rich man and the poor man, Lazarus, who lives in the shadow of the rich man and his wealth. Both die. Lazarus finds himself in heaven; the rich man in the netherworld. The rich man asks for assistance from Lazarus in his torment. But Abraham reminds the rich man of the good things he had in his life and describes the current situation as a reversal of fortunes. The rich man then asks that Lazarus be sent to warn his family, but this is denied with the reminder that Moses and the prophets have warned of judgment for those who neglect the care of the poor.

My dear friends, the parable makes it clear that the opportunity to attend to the needs of others will not last forever. It is either now or never. The rich man might have regretted his past and would have longed for a do-over, but it was too late. This is a serious warning for us to do good with every single opportunity we have. How do we become part of Jesus' FAMILY? By seizing the opportunity and serving. It's how we become His Disciples.






