Readings for the First Sunday of Advent

Gloria:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

First Reading: Is 2:1-5

This is what Isaiah, son of Amoz, saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come, the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it; many peoples shall come and say: "Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths." For from Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and impose terms on many peoples. They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!

Brothers and sisters: You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep. For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed; the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy.

But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh

Gospel: Mt 24:37-44

Jesus said to his disciples: "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man.

Two men will be out in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.".

"Profession of Faith:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven,

and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Administrator's Note

Therefore, stay awake!

My Dear Friends,

The top three words resonate in my mind from today's Gospel reading. Jesus talking with his disciples and giving them a heartfelt message in which they must prepare for the coming of the Son of Man. "At an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come..." (Matthew 25:37-44) We go from celebrating last week Jesus Christ King of the Universe and Thanksgiving, and immediately we move towards Advent, and we are automatically hit with Jesus imploring His Disciples - they must prepare themselves for the coming of the Son of Man. Jesus went as far in the first line of the Gospel to say, "just like in the time of Noah..."

It truly just doesn't seem fair, it seems pretty ruff, but it's really not. As Christians this is what we are called to do.

As we begin the first week of Advent, we are reminded like the disciples, we must be prepared for the coming of our Lord. It's our calling, and what better way to begin the new Liturgical Year with "changing habits" which destroy our relationship with God and learning how to "stay awake."

I'm asking myself one question, while preparing my homily for this weekend. The question is "are we really getting it?" "Do we really understand what the Gospel is saying to us?" This question that I am asking myself truly scares me. I mean, how many of us are "staying awake?" How many of us are prepared? How many of us are ready to leave certain habits or behaviors behind and be prepared?

This first week of Advent for me is what I will call an "opportunity." An opportunity to truly look at our lives in a mirror and see if we are truly "staying awake." We have an opportunity in these next four weeks to "stay awake" and develop a relationship with Christ. To work on things in our lives that need to be corrected, transformed, and healed. To seek forgiveness, understanding, and to love one another. What better way to stay awake and prepare for the coming of the Son of Man.

While writing this reflection, I am reminded that the first candle of Advent, is called the candle of HOPE. I mentioned this because one of the synonyms used for the word OPPORTUNITY, which I used earlier, is HOPE. So, let us not waste this opportunity.

May this Advent Season be one of growth, love, and caring,

Me hago una pregunta, mientras preparo mi homilía para este fin de semana. La pregunta es "¿realmente lo estamos entendiendo?". "¿Entendemos realmente lo que nos dice el Evangelio?". Esta pregunta que me hago me asusta de verdad. Es decir, ¿cuántos de nosotros "nos mantenemos despiertos"? ¿Cuántos de nosotros estamos preparados? ¿Cuántos de nosotros estamos dejar ciertos hábitos o comportamientos y estar preparados?

Esta primera semana de Adviento para mí es lo que llamaré una "oportunidad". Una oportunidad para mirar de verdad nuestras vidas en un espejo y ver si realmente estamos "despiertos". Tenemos la oportunidad en estas próximas cuatro semanas de "permanecer despiertos" y desarrollar una relación con Cristo. Para trabajar en las cosas en nuestras vidas que necesitan ser corregidas, transformadas y sanadas. De buscar el perdón, la comprensión y de amarnos unos a otros. Qué mejor manera de permanecer despiertos y preparar la venida del Hijo del Hombre.

Mientras escribo esta reflexión, recuerdo que la primera vela del Adviento, se llama la vela de la ESPERANZA. Lo menciono porque uno de los sinónimos de la palabra OPORTUNIDAD, que he utilizado antes, es ESPERANZA. Por lo tanto, no desperdiciemos esta oportunidad.

Que este tiempo de Adviento sea de crecimiento, amor y cuidado.
