Readings for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Is 58:7-10

Thus says the LORD: Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own. Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed; your vindication shall go before you, and the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer, you shall cry for help, and he will say: Here I am! If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech; if you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday.

You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house. Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."

Profession of Faith:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Administrator's Note

My Dear Friends,

"We are the light of the world; may our light shine before all, that they may see the good that we do, and give glory to God."

The refrain above comes from the song, "We are the Light of the World." A song written by Jean Anthony Grief. We hear in the Gospel today Jesus saying, "You are the light of the world." Well, then I have one question. Are we a light of this world, or are we still playing with darkness?" ***"Nothing is covered up that will not be revealed or hidden that will not be known. Therefore, whatever you have said in the dark shall be heard in the light, and what you have whispered in private rooms shall be proclaimed on the housetops"*** (Luke 12:2-3).

I must admit, I just *love* this Gospel. It just challenges us to look at the light within ourselves, and if we do give Glory to God, but most importantly this Gospel makes us face and work on the darkness within our own lives...*our sinfulness!!!*

I recently had a conversation with my best friend regarding this subject. I said to him, "one of the saddest things I encounter in the Priesthood are 50, 60, or 70 years old who I perceive not bothered with confronting or facing their own sinfulness. Or, I have come to realize, maybe they just don't know how, or have ever had a person to assist them and show them how to engage our Lord in a personal relationship. At times, and I will say it happens monthly, I will encounter someone coming to confession and I get this shocking response, "*well you know Father, I'm a good person, I don't sin,*" and I'm like, "*really.*"

Jesus saying to us "*You are the light of the World,*" means we have an obligation to bring about the Kingdom of Heaven. We have an obligation to change, to be committed, and prepared to answer our Lord's call. This only happens if we are prepared to "hear." If we have a problem with "*spiritual hearing*" and I'm not talking about the physical handicap, how can we then expect to hear the Lord? As Christians, we must prepare ourselves to battle our darkness, which is our sinfulness, so we can be the light of the world.

Four things have helped me out with my "spiritual hearing" and I would like to share them with you. It truly helps me fight my own sinfulness and encounter the living God. 1) Every day at some time, "***examine your heart.***" Examine your heart for any secrets or shame. When our burdens are brought to the light the darkness starts to disappear. 2) Work on **being authentic**. When one starts bringing to light their secrets, shame, and burdens, we begin to shine and be authentic to ourselves and others. 3) Be a light to others by **encouraging them** to be better. To embrace the truth in their lives, but most importantly to make a difference. 4) Find some time to **read scripture** and meditate upon the Lord's word with reflections.

I find this helps me out tremendously, I hope and pray that ***"We are the light of the world; may our light shine before all, that they may see the good that we do, and give glory to God."***

Queridos amigos,

"Somos la luz del mundo; que nuestra luz brille ante todos, para que vean el bien que hacemos y den gloria a Dios".

El refrán anterior procede de la canción "Somos la luz del mundo". Una canción escrita por Jean Anthony Grief. Escuchamos en el Evangelio de hoy a Jesús diciendo: "Vosotros sois la luz del mundo". Bueno, entonces tengo una pregunta... ¿Somos luz de este mundo, o seguimos jugando con las tinieblas?" ***"Nada hay encubierto que no haya de ser revelado, ni oculto que no haya de saberse. Por eso, lo que habéis dicho en la oscuridad se oír a la luz, y lo que habéis murmurado en privado se proclamará en las azoteas"*** (Lucas 12:2-3).

Debo admitir que me *encanta* este Evangelio. Nos desafía a mirar la luz dentro de nosotros mismos, y si, le damos Gloria a Dios, pero lo más importante es que este Evangelio nos hace enfrentar y trabajar en la oscuridad dentro de nuestras propias vidas... *¡¡¡nuestra pecaminosidad!!!*

Recientemente tuve una conversación con mi mejor amigo sobre este tema. Le dije, "una de las cosas mas tristes, que encuentro en el Sacerdocio son personas de 50, 60, o 70 años que percibo no se molestan en confrontar o enfrentar su propia pecaminosidad. O, me he dado cuenta, tal vez simplemente no saben cómo, o nunca han tenido una persona que les ayude y les muestre cómo comprometerse con nuestro Señor en una relación personal. A veces, y voy a decir que sucede todos los meses, me encuentro con alguien que viene a confesarse y recibo esta respuesta sorprendente: "*Bueno, usted sabe Padre, yo soy una buena persona, yo no peco*", y yo estoy como, "*de verdad*".

Jesús diciéndonos "*Vosotros sois la luz del Mundo*", significa que tenemos la obligación de traer el Reino de los Cielos. Tenemos la obligación de cambiar, de estar comprometidos y preparados para responder a la llamada de nuestro Señor. Esto sólo ocurre si estamos preparados para "escuchar". Si tenemos un problema de "*oído espiritual*", y no me refiero a la discapacidad física, ¿cómo podemos entonces esperar oír al Señor? Como cristianos, debemos prepararnos para luchar contra nuestra oscuridad, que es nuestra pecaminosidad, para que podamos ser la luz del mundo.

Cuatro cosas me han ayudado con mi "oído espiritual" y me gustaría compartirlas con ustedes. Realmente me ayudan a luchar contra mi propia pecaminosidad y a encontrarme con el Dios vivo. 1) Cada día en algún momento, "***examina tu corazón***". Examina tu corazón en busca de cualquier secreto o vergüenza. Cuando nuestras cargas salen a la luz, la oscuridad empieza a desaparecer. 2) Trabaja en **ser auténtico**. Cuando uno empieza a sacar a la luz sus secretos, vergüenzas y cargas, empezamos a brillar y a ser auténticos con nosotros mismos y con los demás. 3) Ser una luz para los demás **animándoles** a ser mejores. A aceptar la verdad en sus vidas, pero sobre todo a hacer la diferencia. 4) Encontrar tiempo para **leer las escrituras** y meditar sobre la palabra del Señor con reflexiones.

Creo que esto me ayuda enormemente, espero y rezo para que ***"Somos la luz del mundo; que nuestra luz brille ante todos, para que vean el bien que hacemos y den gloria a Dios"***.

Epiphany Home Blessing



At one time or another, many have seen the chalk markings on the inside or outside lintel of a door. What does this mean? On the Feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate the Magi visiting the infant Jesus to honor Him as the come Messiah. The tradition has been for families to gather with the parish priest who blesses the entrance door for Jesus to be a daily guest in the home. The markings are made with blessed chalk representing the new year and the first initials of the Magi 20+C+M+B+23, along with the family reciting prayers with the priest. The rooms of the home are also blessed with holy water.

Father Infanti will offer this blessing for the homes of any parishioners who would like to have the Epiphany Home Blessing. The markings are traditionally done with blessed chalk on the lintel OR by placing a printed marker instead. CTGS Nurse Updates For January 2023

February 5th: World Cancer Day

Across the globe, cancer claims more than 10 million lives each year. If left unchecked that number is expected to rise to 13 million by the year 2030. In the United States, nearly 2 million people are living with cancer and over 600,000 people die from cancer each year. The most common cancers in the United States are lung, colorectal, pancreatic, and breast (together these cancers account for 50% of cases and death in the United States). It is estimated that more than one-third of cancers can be prevented, another third can be cured if they are caught and treated early.

What can you do?

- Get Screened: Screening is available for Colon Cancer (beginning at age 45), Lung Cancer (for anyone at high risk due to exposure such as through the work environment or smoking), and Breast Cancer (beginning at age 40 if you are high risk).
