

Readings for the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Sir 15:15-20

If you choose you can keep the commandments, they will save you; if you trust in God, you too shall live; he has set before you fire and water to whichever you choose, stretch forth your hand. Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him. Immense is the wisdom of the Lord; he is mighty in power, and all-seeing. The eyes of God are on those who fear him; he understands man's every deed. No one does he command to act unjustly, to none does he give license to sin.

Second Reading: 1 Cor 2:6-10

Brothers and sisters: We speak a wisdom to those who are mature, not a wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age who are passing away. Rather, we speak God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, which God predetermined before the ages for our glory, and which none of the rulers of this age knew; for, if they had known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But as it is written: What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him, this God has revealed to us through the Spirit.

For the Spirit scrutinizes everything, even the depths of God.

Alleluia: Mt 5:13-16

R. Alleluia, alleluia.

Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth; you have revealed to little ones the mysteries of the kingdom.

R. Alleluia, alleluia.

Gospel: Mt 5:17-37

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. Amen, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or the smallest part of a letter will pass from the law, until all things have taken place. Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do so will be called least in the kingdom of heaven. But whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called greatest in the kingdom of heaven. I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.

"You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment. But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; and whoever says to his brother, 'Raqa,' will be answerable to the Sanhedrin; and whoever says, 'You fool,' will be liable to fiery Gehenna. Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Settle with your opponent quickly while on the way to court. Otherwise your opponent will hand you over to the judge, and the judge will hand you over to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. Amen, I say to you, you will not be released until you have paid the last penny.

"You have heard that it was said, You shall not commit adultery. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body thrown into Gehenna. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body go into Gehenna.

"It was also said, Whoever divorces his wife must give her a bill of divorce. But I say to you, whoever divorces his wife - unless the marriage is unlawful - causes her to commit adultery, and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

"Again you have heard that it was said to your ancestors, Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow. But I say to you, do not swear at all; not by heaven, for it is God's throne; nor by the earth, for it is his footstool; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. Do not swear by your head, for you cannot make a single hair white or black. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one.

Profession of Faith:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven,

(All bow towards the tabernacle)
and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Spiritual Communion Prayer

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.



Administrator's Note

My Dear Friends,

In just 10 days, we will approach the Lenten Season. Ash Wednesday is upon us. We will hear the Priest recite as he places ashes on our foreheads "*Repent and Believe in the Gospel.*" Well, I have just one question to ask you and meditate upon today, "Are we lovers of pleasure or are we lovers of God?" In the Gospel today, the continuation of the Sermon of the Mount is proclaimed, and Jesus does not hold back: "You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment. *But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment.*" Jesus further says, "*You have heard that it was said, you shall not commit adultery. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart.*" Jesus continues to explain, "Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow. *But I say to you, do not swear at all. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.'* Anything more is from the evil one."

Jesus takes His teachings to a deeper level of understanding. As children of God, we come against and attack from worldly pleasures daily. Much of our time is spent trying to entertain ourselves with TVs, cellphones, home entertainment systems, amusement parks, movie theaters, etc. Many of us live for the weekends to party as much as we can. Some work to have money to entertain themselves. The danger is that when we fall in love with the pleasures of the world, we get seduced by many worldly things and may pick up on vices along the way: drugs, alcohol, gambling, and pornography. And just because we call ourselves Christians it does not mean we will not be attacked. Like I have said, the world is constantly calling us and Jesus today in the Gospel is sending a clear message. "*Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world — the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life — is not of the Father but is of the world. And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever.*" (1 John 2:15-17)

In last week's bulletin, I gave four examples that I use personally to make changes and try to engage our Lord in a relationship of spiritual growth and maturity. It's a process, but it's one that our Heavenly Father sees as His disciples falling in love with Him. I leave you the four meditation areas again: 1) Every day at some point examine your heart. 2) Work on being authentic. 3) Encourage others. 4) Read scripture. Do spiritual readings. What better way to begin this practice during Lent, so we can be ready for the Lord's resurrection.

So, I ask again, Are we lovers of pleasures or are we lovers of God?

Queridos amigos,

En sólo 10 días, nos acercaremos al tiempo de Cuaresma. Se acerca el Miércoles de Ceniza. Oiremos al Sacerdote recitar mientras nos pone la ceniza en la frente "*Arrepiéntete y Cree en el Evangelio.*" Pues bien, hoy sólo tengo una pregunta que haceros y sobre la cual meditar: "*¿Somos amantes del placer o somos amantes de Dios?*". En el Evangelio de hoy, se proclama la continuación del Sermón de la Montaña, y Jesús no se contiene: "*No matarás; y el que mate será reo de juicio. Pero yo les digo: el que se enoje con su hermano será reo de juicio.*" Jesús dice además: "*Habéis oído que se dijo: No cometáis adulterio. Pero yo les digo que todo el que mira a una mujer con lujuria ya ha cometido adulterio con ella en su corazón.*" Jesús continúa explicando: "*No juréis en falso, sino cumplid al Señor todo lo que juréis. Pero yo les digo: No juren en absoluto. Que nuestro 'Sí' signifique 'Sí', y nuestro 'No' signifique 'No'. Todo lo demás es del maligno.*"

Jesús lleva sus enseñanzas a un nivel más profundo de comprensión. Como hijos de Dios, nos enfrentamos y atacamos de los placeres mundanos diariamente. Mucho de nuestro tiempo lo pasamos tratando de entretenernos con televisores, celulares, sistemas de entretenimiento en casa, parques de diversiones, cines, etc. Muchos de nosotros vivimos para los fines de semana para festejar tanto como podamos. Algunos trabajan para tener dinero con el que entretenerte. El peligro es que cuando nos enamoramos de los placeres del mundo, nos dejamos seducir por muchas cosas mundanas y podemos coger vicios por el camino: drogas, alcohol, juego y pornografía. Y sólo porque nos llamemos cristianos no significa que no seremos atacados. Como he dicho, el mundo nos llama constantemente y Jesús hoy en el Evangelio nos envía un mensaje claro. "*No améis al mundo ni las cosas que hay en el mundo. Si alguien ama al mundo, el amor del Padre no está en él. Porque todo lo que hay en el mundo -los deseos de la carne, los deseos de los ojos y el orgullo de la vida- no viene del Padre, sino del mundo. Y el mundo pasa, y sus lujurias; pero el que hace la voluntad de Dios permanece para siempre.*" (1 Juan 2:15-17)

En el boletín de la semana pasada, di cuatro ejemplos que uso personalmente para hacer cambios y tratar de comprometer a nuestro Señor en una relación de crecimiento y madurez espiritual. Es un proceso, pero es uno que nuestro Padre Celestial ve como Sus discípulos enamorándose de Él. Te dejo de nuevo las cuatro áreas de meditación: 1) Cada día en algún momento examina tu corazón. 2) Trabaja en ser auténtico. 3) Anima a los demás. 4) Lee las Escrituras. Haz lecturas espirituales. Qué mejor manera de comenzar esta práctica durante la Cuaresma, para que podamos estar preparados para la resurrección del Señor.

Así que, pregunto de nuevo, ¿Somos amantes de los placeres o somos amantes de Dios?

Epiphany Home Blessing



At one time or another, many have seen the chalk markings on the inside or outside lintel of a door. What does this mean? On the Feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate the Magi visiting the infant Jesus to honor Him as the come Messiah. The tradition has been for families to gather with the parish priest who blesses the entrance door for Jesus to be a daily guest in the home. The markings are made with blessed chalk representing the new year and the first initials of the Magi 20+C+M+B+23, along with the family reciting prayers with the priest. The rooms of the home are also blessed with holy water.

Father Infant will offer this blessing for the homes of any parishioners who would like to have the Epiphany Home Blessing. The markings are traditionally done with blessed chalk on the lintel OR by placing a printed marker instead. CTGS Nurse Updates For February 2023

February 12 th : Burn Awareness

Nearly half a million Americans experience a burn that requires medical treatment each year. In addition to exposure to fire or flame, many burns are caused by hot liquids, scalding (from steam), or contact with a hot surface. Burns can also occur from electrical current and exposure to chemical substances. The majority of burns occur in the home (74%).

What can you do?

This year's burn awareness week theme focuses on preventing burns associated with handling

hot liquids. Simple tips to avoid liquid burns include:

- Testing bath water temperature before bathing (especially infants and children)
- Do not hold hot liquids or foods and a child/infant at the same time
 - o Open lids of microwaved foods away from you to avoid scald burns from steam

Other burn safety tips include:

- Have working smoke detectors on all floors
- Use caution when cooking (ex. do not leave cooking unattended, be attentive to potential splash hazards during frying or boiling, always use oven-safe mitts when

handling hot cookware, turn handles away from the stove's edge, mind your sleeves when cooking).

- Use care when handling flammable materials (such as gasoline), when using oxygen in the home, around campfires, fire places, and wood/alternative fuel stoves).
