

### Readings for the Third Sunday of Advent

#### **First Reading:** Is 35:1-6a, 10

The desert and the parched land will exult; the steppe will rejoice and bloom. They will bloom with abundant flowers and rejoice with joyful song. The glory of Lebanon will be given to them, the splendor of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the LORD, the splendor of our God. Strengthen the hands that are feeble, make firm the knees that are weak, say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the mute will sing. Those whom the LORD has ransomed will return and enter Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy; they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will flee.

Jesus said to them in reply, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me." As they were going off, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John, "What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind? Then what did you go out to see? Someone dressed in fine clothing? Those who wear fine clothing are in royal palaces. Then why did you go out? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written: Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you. Amen, I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."


**Profession of Faith:**

## Administrator's Note

My Dear Friends,

A great experience which I truly believe one should have is the experience of a "silent retreat." Just recently, I was having a conversation with my close friend, and I was explaining to him the experience of a "silent retreat" and the great encounter one has with God. He would have questions ranging from, "what do you do during a silent retreat?" Then of course, he was waiting I guess for his follow up question, and "how do you do that?" I realized his questions were not just about wanting to know of my experience, which is understandable, but it was about him searching for himself. We all at some level need to have an "encounter" with God. This encounter needs to be private. Away from people, family, friends, cell phones, and of course the dreaded television. We need to be away from everything that causes us to have a distraction from our Lord. We need our encounter with silence. As I was explaining the retreat to my friend, I was describing to him also of the experiences one begins to have in complete silence. It's very ruff because thoughts, memories, encounters, events, practices, and incidents from life come to your mind. I personally call the first three days of a silent retreat "the barrens." Barrens is defined as "producing little or no vegetation: desolate, barren deserts. For me it's a lot of noise, I must weed out to find silence with God. I must get rid of all the distractions, so I can begin to give fruit.

In the Gospel today, our Lord was talking about John the Baptist, and He asked the people a question, "What did you go out to the desert to see?" Yes, maybe it was their curiosity, but something special was leading them to the desert. Whether we like it or not, we all must encounter the "desert" in our lives. Those "barrens!" It's the only way we grow spiritually and learn about ourselves and our relationship with God. Whatever we choose to call it: silence, the barrens, the deserts, or vacation, we need to have a private encounter with God.

I have a question, "Do you feel that God is leading you into the wilderness or the desert? Or did you feel that your life is lost in the desert? We truly need to ask ourselves these questions regularly. When we feel strong enough to have this encounter with our Lord, I would like to share some techniques which have assisted me through my Christian journey. 1. Embrace the silence and know that it will not last forever. It's at this moment we encounter our Lord. 2. Journal everything that comes to your mind, even your feelings. The good, the bad, and the ugly. It's those thoughts we must see, and our Lord wants to show us. It's also those things we need to work on. It's important to realize that any thoughts and or feelings that you may have during this time – it's our Lord speaking with you. 3. During this time it's important to realize "the barrens" take place. Resist the temptation to feel lost. Resist the temptation to break your silence. 4. Take your time and spend as much time as you need with our Heavenly Father.

Always remember that even Jesus went through the wilderness, the desert, and showed us this is a part of our Spiritual Journey. May this Third Week of Advent be one of blessings.

Mis queridos amigos,

Una gran experiencia que realmente creo que uno debe tener es la experiencia de un "retiro de silencio". Hace poco, estaba conversando con un amigo cercano, y le explicaba la experiencia de un "retiro de silencio" y el gran encuentro que uno tiene con Dios. Él tenía preguntas que iban desde "¿qué se hace durante un retiro de silencio?". Luego, por supuesto, esperaba, supongo, su pregunta de seguimiento, y "¿cómo se hace eso?". Me di cuenta de que sus preguntas no se limitaban a querer conocer mi experiencia, lo cual es comprensible, sino que se trataba de una búsqueda de sí mismo. Todos, en algún nivel, necesitamos tener un "encuentro" con Dios. Este encuentro debe ser privado. Lejos de la gente, de la familia, de los amigos, de los teléfonos móviles y, por supuesto, de la temida televisión. Necesitamos estar lejos de todo lo que nos hace tener una distracción de nuestro Señor. Necesitamos nuestro encuentro con el silencio. Mientras explicaba el retiro a mi amigo, le describía también las experiencias que uno empieza a tener en el silencio total. Es muy duro porque te vienen a la cabeza pensamientos, recuerdos, encuentros, acontecimientos, prácticas e incidentes de la vida. Personalmente, yo llamo a los tres primeros días de un retiro en silencio "los barrens". Barrens se define como "que produce poca o ninguna vegetación: desolación, desiertos estériles". Para mí es un montón de ruido que debo eliminar para encontrar el silencio con Dios. Debo deshacerme de todas las distracciones, para empezar a dar fruto.

En el Evangelio de hoy, nuestro Señor estaba hablando de Juan el Bautista, y le hizo una pregunta a la gente: "¿Qué has ido a ver en el desierto?". Sí, tal vez fue su curiosidad, pero algo especial les llevó al desierto. Nos guste o no, todos debemos encontrar el "desierto" en nuestras vidas. Esos "barruntos". Es la única manera de crecer espiritualmente y aprender sobre nosotros mismos y nuestra relación con Dios. Como quiera que lo llamemos: el silencio, los barrens, los desiertos o las vacaciones, necesitamos tener un encuentro privado con Dios.

Tengo una pregunta: "¿Sientes que Dios te lleva al desierto? ¿O sientes que tu vida está perdida en el desierto? Realmente necesitamos hacernos estas preguntas con regularidad. Cuando nos sentimos con fuerzas para tener este encuentro con nuestro Señor, me gustaría compartir algunas técnicas que me han ayudado a lo largo de mi camino cristiano. 1. Abraza el silencio y saber que no va a durar para siempre. Es en este momento cuando nos encontramos con nuestro Señor. 2. Anota todo lo que te venga a la mente, incluso tus sentimientos. Lo bueno, lo malo y lo feo. Son esos pensamientos los que debemos ver, y nuestro Señor quiere mostrarnos. También son esas cosas en las que tenemos que trabajar. Es importante darse cuenta de que cualquier pensamiento y o sentimiento que puedes tener durante este tiempo – es nuestro Señor hablando contigo. 3. Durante este tiempo es importante darse cuenta de que "los barruntos" tienen lugar. Resiste la tentación de sentirte perdido. Resiste la tentación de romper tu silencio. 4. Tómate tu tiempo y pasa todo el tiempo que necesites con nuestro Padre Celestial. Recuerda siempre que también Jesús pasó por el desierto, y nos mostró que esto es parte de nuestro Camino Espiritual. 
